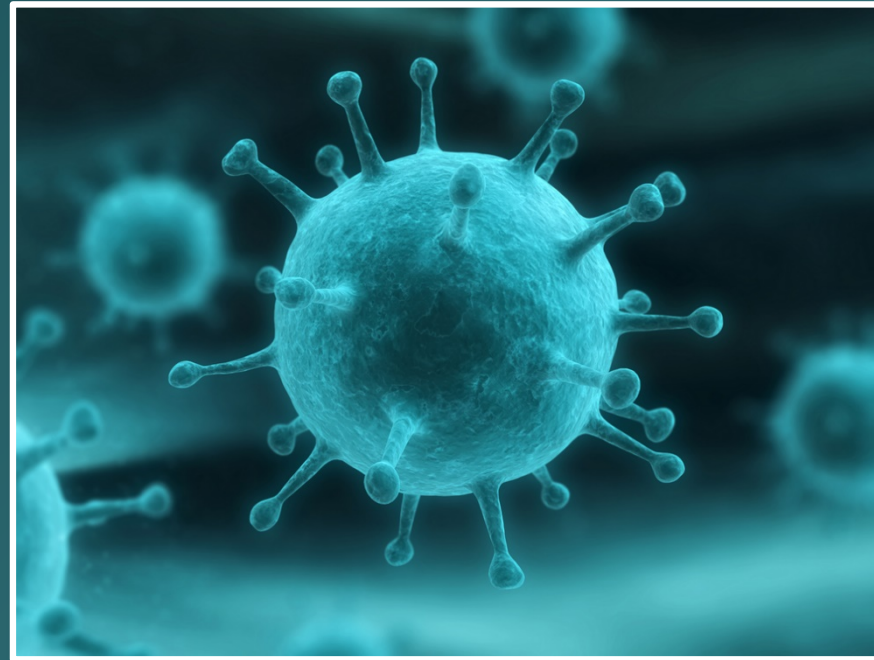

2020 Atlantic Hurricane Season Forecast

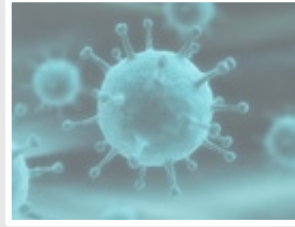

Preparing for Hurricane Season



- Plan now.
 - Review your facility's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP).
 - Be flexible; COVID-19 may change your plans.
 - Back-up facility agreements
 - Manage COVID-19 positive patients pre- and post-storm
 - Ensure that all facility staff are educated and understand the facility's plans for the 2020 hurricane season.
 - Ensure that staff have their own personal preparedness plan.

Preparing for Hurricane Season (cont.)



- Educate your patients on the facility's plans.
 - Ensure that patients know what to do, where to go, and who to contact in the event of an emergency.
 - Update all patients' contact information.
 - Have an understanding of each patient's evacuation plans.
 - Where do they plan to go if they must evacuate?
 - Out of the area
 - Shelter
 - Other
 - Provide each patient with a current copy of their dialysis treatment prescription prior to any known event.

Additional Planning Considerations



- Have you contacted your local emergency management officials?
 - Stay informed. Pay attention to local guidance about updated plans for evacuations and sheltering.
- Are you a member of your local healthcare coalition?
- Review the latest CDC guidance on COVID-19 and discuss how it may affect your hurricane planning.
- Public transportation services may shut down to assist with hurricane evacuations, so make alternate arrangements for transportation now.

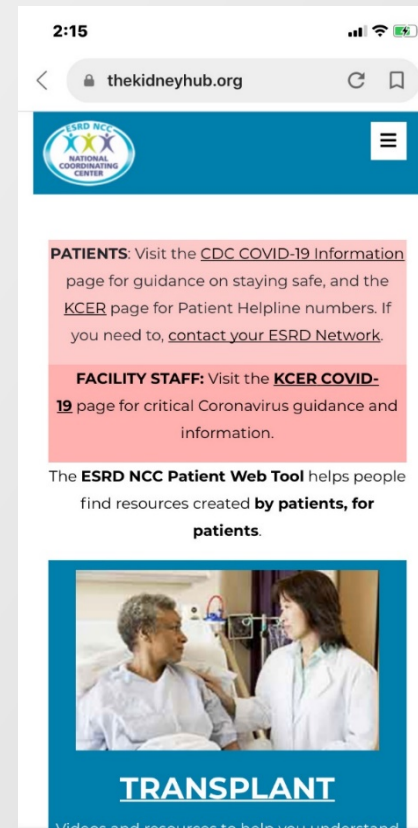
